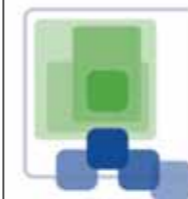

INTRAC's 20th anniversary conference in December will address the topic of 'civil society and economic growth: a new frontier'.
